PREAMBLE

Foundations Of The Constitution

WHEREAS, the desire and vision to pioneer and establish a Christian society of a Pentecostal nature for expansion of kingdom of God in Tanzania was first found in the heart of the minister and servant of God brother Sylvester Gamanywa in the year 1984;

WHEREAS, the establishment of the said society was made possible in the year 1990, being constituted and legally registered as “The World Apostolic Ministries” under the Societies Ordinance, 1954; now the Societies Act [Cap.337 2002]; given registration number SO. 7291;

WHEREAS, the first amendment of the Constitution of 1990 of the aforesaid society was made in the year 1997, thereof changing its name from the “World Apostolic Ministries” to the “Word and Pentecostal Organizations” and abbreviated as “WAPO”;

WHEREAS, in the year 2000 another major amendments of the said Constitution were carried out, thus, changing the name of the said society from the “Word and Pentecostal Organizations” to the Word and Peace Organizations” [WAPO];

AND WHEREAS, the so far made amendments in the said Constitution had been over passed by both social and Christian needs, and can no longer withstand the test of time;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT HAS BEEN DECLARED BY THIS MEETING THAT, the Constitution of 1990 be replaced by this Constitution which accommodates among other things, the change of the name of the Christian society from the “Word and Peace Organizations” to “WAPO MISSION INTERNATIONAL” or in its acronym WMI; reflecting new vision, missions, core values, guiding principles and structure of the said Christian society with view to working with not only Local Christian Community but also International Christian Community in new global context while adhering to the Great Commission given by our Lord Jesus Christ.

THE ORIGIN OF WMI VISION

Background

WAPO MISSION INTERNATIONAL, abbreviated WMI, is a Christian organization established in 1984, and given registration number SO 7291, and its headquarters are currently located in Mbezi Beach, Dar es Salaam.

the origin of WAPO MISSION INTERNATIONAL is directly linked to a significant spiritual experience undergone by Rev. Sylvester Gamanywa in October 1984. During this time, he felt a strong spiritual inspiration to undertake a prolonged period of fasting and prayer. This fast involved abstaining from food and consuming only water, and it was intended to last for 28 days, with prayer conducted day and night.

Rev. Gamanywa's motivation for embarking on this rigorous fast stemmed from spiritual challenges he was facing at that particular time. Additionally, he drew inspiration from the biblical account of Jesus Christ, who fasted for 40 days and nights in the wilderness and subsequently returned empowered by the Spirit.

At that point in his life, Rev. Gamanywa was a young man serving as an unpaid preacher of the Gospel. As he did not have a private space suitable for such an extended period of focused prayer, he chose to go to the top of Kwakoko hill, which is located near the town of Same, to conduct his fast and prayers.

A pivotal moment occurred during the initial phase of the fast. Within the first five days, Rev. Gamanywa experienced receiving revelations, described as new divine ideas in his heart, in a manner he perceived as miraculous. Among these revelations was a specific and clear inspiration to establish a mission organization.

This divine idea, received during the fast on Kwakoko hill in October 1984, served as the foundational inspiration and direct origin for the establishment of the mission organization that is now widely recognized and known as WAPO MISSION INTERNATIONAL (WMI).

Vision

The vision of WAPO Mission International shall be to bringing forth a new God fearing generation of good morals, trustworthy leadership, owning of sustainable economy instituted on principles of the Kingdom of God on earth.

Mission

The Mission of WAPO Mission International shall be to mobilise, educate and restore Biblical moral values to individuals in the society.

Focused Areas

Focus areas for WAPO Mission International shall be-

- (a) Mobilization;
- (b) Restoration;
- (c) Education; and
- (d) Church planting programs.

Core Values

The core values of WAPO Mission International shall be-

- (a) The salvation in Christ;
- (b) The power and Unity in the Holy Spirit;
- (c) The Word of God;
- (d) Agape love;
- (e) Sanctification;
- (f) Integrity;
- (g) Responsible stewardship; and
- (h) Peace and tranquillity.

Belief And Tenets Of Faith

1. We believe that: (a) the scriptures of the Holy Bible in both old and New Testament are verbally inspired of God inerrant in the original writings, the supreme and final authority in faith and life; (b) there is one God and only one, eternally existing in three persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit;
2. The father is the most High God, the Supreme God the creator of heavens and earth and sits at the throne in heaven;
3. Jesus Christ is begotten of the Holy Spirit and was born of the virgin Mary. Jesus lived a sinless life, died a vicarious and substitutionary death upon the cross as a sacrifice for our sins, rose again the third day for our justification. Jesus is now our Mediator and High Priest at God's right hand, from whence He will come to earth as a King of Kings and Lord of lords to set up His Kingdom and to judge the world in righteousness;
4. The Holy Spirit is the third Person of the Godhead. His Ministry is that of convicting unbelievers of their sins and their need of the Lord Jesus Christ as their Saviour. He baptises believers into the Body of Christ, indwells, instructs and seals them into the day of redemption.
5. We believe that- (a) a man was created in the image of God. The man sinned and thereby incurred physical and spiritual death that is separation from God. Salvation for sinful man is by grace through faith in Christ "*who by His own self bore our sins in His own body on the cross*"; (b) all those who refuse to avail themselves to this divine provision for redemption will suffer the eternal retribution of the wicked in hell; while those who avail themselves of this are kept by the power of God, shall never perish, shall never be separated from the love of God and shall enjoy the eternal bliss and felicity of heaven; and (c) every sinner who wants to enter heaven must be born a second time, baptised with water by immersion and become a new creature as per Mk 16:16, 2Cor 5:17;
6. It is our belief that, every believer has a promise of being baptised in the Holy Spirit and the sign of speaking in an unknown language in order to speak to God about secret things in his spirit and to worship God in spirit and in truth as written in Acts 1:4,8, 2:1-4, 14-17, 38-39, 10:44-47,

19:1-7 and 1Cor 14:2,14.

7. For the purpose of strengthening the faith in Christ, every believer shall- (a) join the System of cell groups in the neighbourhood where he or she lives and breaks bread from house to house like the church of the apostles and believers of the first century as per Acts 2:41-42, 46-47; (b) be required to attend gathering together with other members as is the customs of others in church gatherings for the purpose of conversing and building each others in faith in preparation for the rapture of the church of Christ as per Heb 10:24-25; and (c) live a life of sanctification by separating from non believers and not touching anything unclean in order to maintain fellowship with God as Father and us as children as written in 2 Cor 6:14-18
8. In our belief, the church is an elect company of believers, the Body of which Jesus Christ is the Head and is without denominational boundaries.
9. We believe and encourage a personal call from God to serve Jesus Christ through the performance of the gifts of services for the building of the body of Christ as well as the gifts of the Spirit guided by the fruits of the Spirit as per Acts 13:1-3, 1Cor 12:4-11, Gal 5:16, 18,22-25 and Mk 16:16. (2) For the purpose of sub article (1), there must be personal efforts to obey and implement Christ's Great Commission to make all nations and tribes disciples by teaching them to observe all that Jesus commanded as written in Mt 28:19-20.
10. Believers of WAPO Mission International shall be obliged to submit, obey and respect governing authorities established by God on earth as per Rom 13:1-7, 1Pet 2:13-17 and Heb 13:17.
11. The interpretation of Marriage is a union between a man and a woman as written in the Bible. For those who are already married in the Lord, no permission for divorce and remarry. They can separate as long as they remain as they are (Gen 1:27 – 28;2:21 – 24; Mk 10:6 – 9; 10:11 – 12; 1 Cor 7:11 – 12).
12. We believe that, there shall be an event of the rapture of the saints that will take place after Jesus Christ descends from the clouds, and the dead in Christ will be resurrected first and the rest of us who are alive will receive new bodies of glory and then be caught up together with them to meet Jesus in the clouds and go with Him to the throne of God the Father in Heaven as written in John 14:1-3, 1Thes 4:14-18, 1Cor 15:50-53, 2Thes 2:3-7.

WMI Initiatives And Projects

Understanding the Approach of Archbishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa

Archbishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa's approach to ministry reflects a significant interpretation of the apostolic model established by Paul the Apostle. This model emphasizes self-sufficiency and personal responsibility in ministry, diverging from reliance on external financial support.

The Apostolic Model of Paul

Paul the Apostle is often cited as a foundational figure in Christian ministry, known for his tireless work ethic and commitment to spreading the Gospel. His teachings and practices provide a blueprint for many contemporary leaders in faith communities. Notably, Paul emphasized earning one's living through hard work rather than depending solely on donations or offerings from those he served. He famously stated, *"You yourselves know that these hands of mine have supplied my own needs and the needs of my companions"* (Acts 20:34). This statement underscores his belief in the dignity of labor and the importance of self-reliance.

Application by Archbishop Gamanywa

In emulating Paul's example, Archbishop Gamanywa has chosen to leverage his professional skills—specifically in media and business—to create sustainable projects that can fund his ministry efforts. By doing so, he aligns with Paul's teaching that it is more blessed to give than to receive (Acts 20:35). This approach not only supports his immediate needs but also allows him to reinvest profits into church-related activities, thereby fostering growth within his community.

Self-Sustainability in Ministry

The concept of self-sustainability is crucial in modern ministry contexts where financial resources may be limited or inconsistent. By initiating self-sustaining projects, Archbishop Gamanywa aims to empower both himself and those around him economically while simultaneously promoting spiritual growth through reinvestment into Gospel initiatives. This strategy reflects a proactive stance towards ministry funding, ensuring that resources are available without compromising the integrity or mission of the church.

The first initiatives and projects established by Archbishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa included Shalom Pre-Primary Schools; WMI media facilities such as Msemakweli Newspapers, WAPO Radio FM, and WAPO TV; the establishment of WMI Company Ltd and its subsidiary GAFACO Ltd; and YSSCL Security Company Ltd.

In summary, Archbishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa's approach mirrors that of Paul by emphasizing self-sufficiency through professional skills rather than relying on external aid. His commitment to creating sustainable projects not only supports his ministry but also embodies the principle that hard work can lead to greater blessings for both giver and receiver.

Shalom Pre-Primary Schools

The vision behind the establishment of Shalom Pre-Primary School was sparked by the challenge of moral decadence that had started to affect educational institutions in Dar Es Salaam. It was at this point that Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa decided to establish a school on the premises of WMI that focuses on protecting children's morals and providing quality education.

The founder of Shalom Pre-Primary School, Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa, identified a need for an educational institution that prioritizes both moral values and academic excellence. This decision was influenced by the observation of declining moral standards in Dar Es Salaam's educational sector.

Prof. Gamanywa collaborated with his partner, who also brought his two children—one girl and one boy—to the initiative. Thus, Shalom Nursery School began its operations in 1997. This marked the beginning of a new educational endeavor aimed at addressing the moral and educational needs of young children in Dar es Salaam.

Currently, Shalom Mission Pre- and Primary School is a legally registered institution recognized by the relevant authorities under Reg. No. EM 15057 and has been operating for over 30 years, during which a considerable number of pupils have studied at this school; some of them have now become prominent leaders and workers in public and private institutions.

As of 2025, David and Shi'ma, the children of Prof. Gamanywa, have graduated from university. Moreover, they are married, and each has two sons. This development reflects not only the growth of the children but also the success of the educational vision set forth by their father.

WAPO Media Facility Services



MSEMA KWELI NEWSPAPER

In 1992, Bishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa conceived the idea of starting a Christian media network as a great way to reach many people at once and in a short time. As a professional in the media industry, he founded the first Pentecostal Christian newspaper in Tanzania.

At that time, it was difficult to obtain official registration for a private media outlet, but by grace, he secured the registration of Msemakweli newspaper, which has been printed and distributed on the streets for over 30 years.

Through Msemakweli Newspaper, he managed to publish about 10,416 teaching articles over this period of more than 30 years.

Even though Msemakweli newspaper is of Pentecostal faith, as an independent media outlet it has considered the values of news, including serving as a communication platform for various Christian sects and advertisements for all types of readers regardless of religion, race, or gender. Currently, Msemakweli is regarded and highly respected as a voice platform for the Christian community in matters of faith and social issues in East Africa.

WAPO RADIO FM 98.1 MHz

10 years after the establishment of Msemakweli Newspaper, in 2002, Bishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa managed to establish the first Pentecostal Radio focused on promoting Christian values without mixing secular music.

For a period of over 23 years, he was able to produce 31,248 of live streaming shows sermons and intercessions, that has transformed hundred millions of listeners.



WAPO TV ONLINE

In 2016, I decided to focus on social networks on the internet, where we opened a channel on YouTube called SHALOM TV, which we later changed to WAPO TV ONLINE. This is licensed from TCRA.

Through WAPO TV Online I have managed to broadcast about 336 live Sunday worship programs in a period of 7 years (2016-2022) and reached about 336,0M viewers.

In addition, in parallel with the broadcasting of Announcements through Youtube, I also opened a page on Facebook in the name of BISHOP SYLVESTER GAMANYWA where I have about 424,000 followers who follow my teachings every day.



WAPOMEDIA House is an initiative founded by Archbishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa, strategically located at WMI-HQ Mbezi Beach, Plots 50/51, Kerai Street, Jogoo, Bagamoyo Rd., Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania. This media house serves as a central hub for all media-related programs under the umbrella of WAPO MISSION INTERNATIONAL.

Vision

WAPOMEDIA platforms working as one for all WAPO Mission International media related programs.

Mission

To integrate, coordinate and cooperate all media platforms being used by WAPO Mission International as one WAPOMEDIA to deliver uniform communication to the organization's publics.

Main Focus

The main focus of this integration and coordination of WAPOMEDIA platforms are WMI's periodical programs. Every year the WMI comes up with a specific program(s) for implementation. Therefore, WAPOMEDIA, as a collective body of all platforms must plan to provide media support for the program(s).

WMI'S PROMOTION AND INFLUENCE ON PENTECOSTAL MOVEMENT IN TANZANIA

Ministerial Affiliation Facility

Between 1995 and 2002, Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa, the Founder of WMI, gained the wisdom to establish an umbrella unit to cover ministries and churches with a vision similar to WMI, enabling them to freely conduct Gospel ministries under WMI. Within a period of seven years, approximately 200 local and foreign ministries, as well as churches, were established.

Ultimately, Bishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa facilitated government registration for all who were under the WMI umbrella, some of whom are now large ministries and churches in Tanzania. This effort was part of fulfilling the responsibility of recognizing and enabling the gifts of emerging ministers according to the Bible.

Founding of the Churches of Pentecostal Council of Tanzania (CPCT)

Moreover, from 1992 onwards, Bishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa was inspired to establish what is currently known as the Churches of the Pentecostal Council of Tanzania (CPCT). During that time, there were numerous political and religious challenges that affected the freedom of worship for some churches, particularly those of the Pentecostal faith.

As if that were not enough, within those churches, there were challenges related to leadership conflicts caused by some foreign aid and others resulting from competition for leadership power. Through his personal research and prayers to God, he managed to convene meetings with top senior leaders of Pentecostal churches and shared with them the need to establish a national Pentecostal leadership body similar to organizations such as CCT, TEC, and BAKWATA.

Finally, in 1993, the application for the registration of the Pentecostal Council of Tanzania (PCT) was approved by government authorities and launched by the Minister for Home Affairs on the condition that all legal disputes were removed from court and settled amicably under the PCT. From this period of 1993 to 2025, there has been an increase in Pentecostal and Charismatic growth from 1.5 million to 12 million, and this number is increasing significantly.

WMI BIBLE COLLEGE (WBC)

Background

Upon his arrival in Dar Es Salaam, Archbishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa established one of his very first ministries, The Dar-Es-Salaam Evening Bible School, abbreviated as DEBS. Founded in 1990, DEBS initially offered Certificate-level Discipleship and Church leadership service. The curriculum at DEBS centered on teachings concerning the “Blueprint of the First Church,” which refers to the early Christian community that originated on the day of Pentecost in Jerusalem. The teaching faculty included Pentecostal pastors, among whom was a Missionary Pastor from Canada. A significant outcome of DEBS was that 17 members of the small church in the City of DSM founded by Archbishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa were among its graduates. In 2005, after the church ministries relocated from Temeke district area to Mbezi Beach which is in Kinondoni district within Dar Es Salaam, the Bible college was re-established and subsequently became widely recognized as WMI Bible College (WBC).



WBC offers training programs ranging from Certificate to Special Diploma, offered in Swahili, Diploma and Degree programs offered in English. These trainings are conducted online as well as in regular classes located at the WMI headquarters in Mbezi Beach and branches in Chanika, Kibamba, Bagamoyo, and Kiluvia.

Vision and mission

The vision of this college is to be a “College of Transformation.” Our goal is to make disciples of Jesus Christ and to prepare faithful servants who can effectively carry out the ministries of Apostleship, Prophecy, Evangelism, Pastoring, and Teaching, as outlined in Ephesians 4:11. We aim to serve not only the National Church but also the Body of Christ at large.

The college exists with the commitment to “prepare spiritual leaders empowered by the Holy Spirit to reach the nations.” To achieve this purpose, every activity conducted at this college is designed to benefit students by equipping them spiritually, intellectually, and in service. This holistic approach ensures that our graduates are well-prepared to fulfill their mission in various ministry contexts.



Specific Objectives

To prepare born-again believers to walk in the ongoing anointing of the Holy Spirit throughout the world.

- To provide a solid foundation of biblical knowledge for demonstrating the works of the Gospel of Signs and Wonders, as well as for the distribution of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.
- To build students' capacity for ministry work in Tanzania and globally.
- To identify and consecrate individuals who demonstrate ministry gifts.



WMI VISION FROM SMALL CHURCH TO MEGA CHURCH.

Bishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa, when he founded the church under WMI in 1992, faced the challenge of shepherding a congregation of a few believers in the large city of Dar es Salaam. For a period of ten years, the local church did not grow beyond 200 members.

Eventually, he decided to conduct research with leaders of mega churches worldwide, including those in South Korea. His research inspired him to initiate campaigns for healing prayers and the infilling of the Holy Spirit. He set a goal to bring at least 1 million people to Jesus, famously known as “One Million for Jesus.”

This was a special strategy to preach the full Gospel of salvation, supernatural healings for diseases and chronic problems, setting the captives free from the power of evil spirits, and praying for baptism in the power of the Holy Spirit as a movement of “Back to the ACTS” of the first church.

Prof. Gamanywa started broadcasting invitations through WAPO RADIO FM and Msemakweli Newspaper. This evangelistic strategy of Deliverance Campaigns known as HAKUNA LISILO-WEZEKANA was officially launched on 9/5/2003



150 first harvest for the first evangelistic indoor meetings

From that day on, the response has been tremendous! Thousands of people from all over the city have attended these healing services, from those who were desperately ill to those suffering from paralysis.

From May 2003 up to June 2004 the congregation attendance grew in number from 80 up to 2500. This rapid attendance growth is a result of WAPO RADIO FM advertisements and “Live” Preaching programs of HAKUNA LISILOWEZEKANA.



After two months we moved outside in tents

In June 2004, due to the limited space at WAPO MISSION premises, these meetings were shifted into a larger Hall, formerly known as PTA at Sabasaba Grounds. It was over there, where the number of attendance increased from 2500 up to 6300.



Three months later tents were not enough, people had to stand outside the tents. From there, we shifted to Sabasaba Grounds, Kurasini

However, after shifting from PTA Hall to a new center at Mbezi Beach, the number of attendance decreased from 6,300 up to 4,200 per week. This is due to the fact that at every major shifting change of any congregation from one location to another the attendance always drops from 30% up to 70%.

The conclusion of church growth from a small church to a mega church is illustrated by the experience of WMI in Dar es Salaam. Established in 1992 with only 17 members, the church faced limitations that capped its growth at 200 members for a decade.

However, in 2003, Bishop Prof. Sylvester Gamanywa implemented a new management style that prioritized addressing the spiritual, health, social, and economic needs of the congregation. This strategic shift led to significant growth, resulting in a current network of 2,848,452 members who have believed and been baptized over a span of 33 years (1992-2025).

ONE BILLION GLOBAL MISSION 2030 INITIATIVE



Following the significant results of the One Million for Jesus strategy in its first five years, Bishop Prof. Gamanywa was inspired to seek God through prayer for spiritual motivation, desiring to continue the campaign to bring millions of people to Jesus.

In 2022, at the large hall of WMI-HQ Mbezi in Dar Es Salaam, he held a Holy Spirit conference that gathered senior leaders from East Africa and the United States and launched the ONE BILLION GLOBAL MISSION 2030 strategy.

Bishop Prof. Gamanywa has articulated a bold vision to strategize the making of **1 billion Disciples for Jesus by the year 2030**, drawing inspiration from the biblical passage Matthew 28:19, which emphasizes the importance of making disciples of all nations. This initiative reflects a significant commitment to evangelism and outreach, leveraging modern technology to reach a vast audience. In his pursuit of this ambitious goal, Prof. Gamanywa conducted surveys that revealed approximately **5.31 billion** people are currently using social media platforms globally. By utilizing these platforms, the campaign aims to engage with individuals who may not have access to traditional forms of ministry.

Prof. Gamanywa's motivation is further bolstered by his extensive experience in outreach over the past decade (2016-2022). During this period, he successfully utilized networks and radio channels to reach an impressive **330 million people**. This track record demonstrates his capability in mobilizing resources and effectively communicating messages across diverse audiences.

The **ONE BILLION GLOBAL MISSION 2030** initiative is a multifaceted program aimed at engaging and empowering individuals, particularly targeting younger generations such as Millennials and Generation Z. This initiative is characterized by several key components that reflect its mission and objectives.

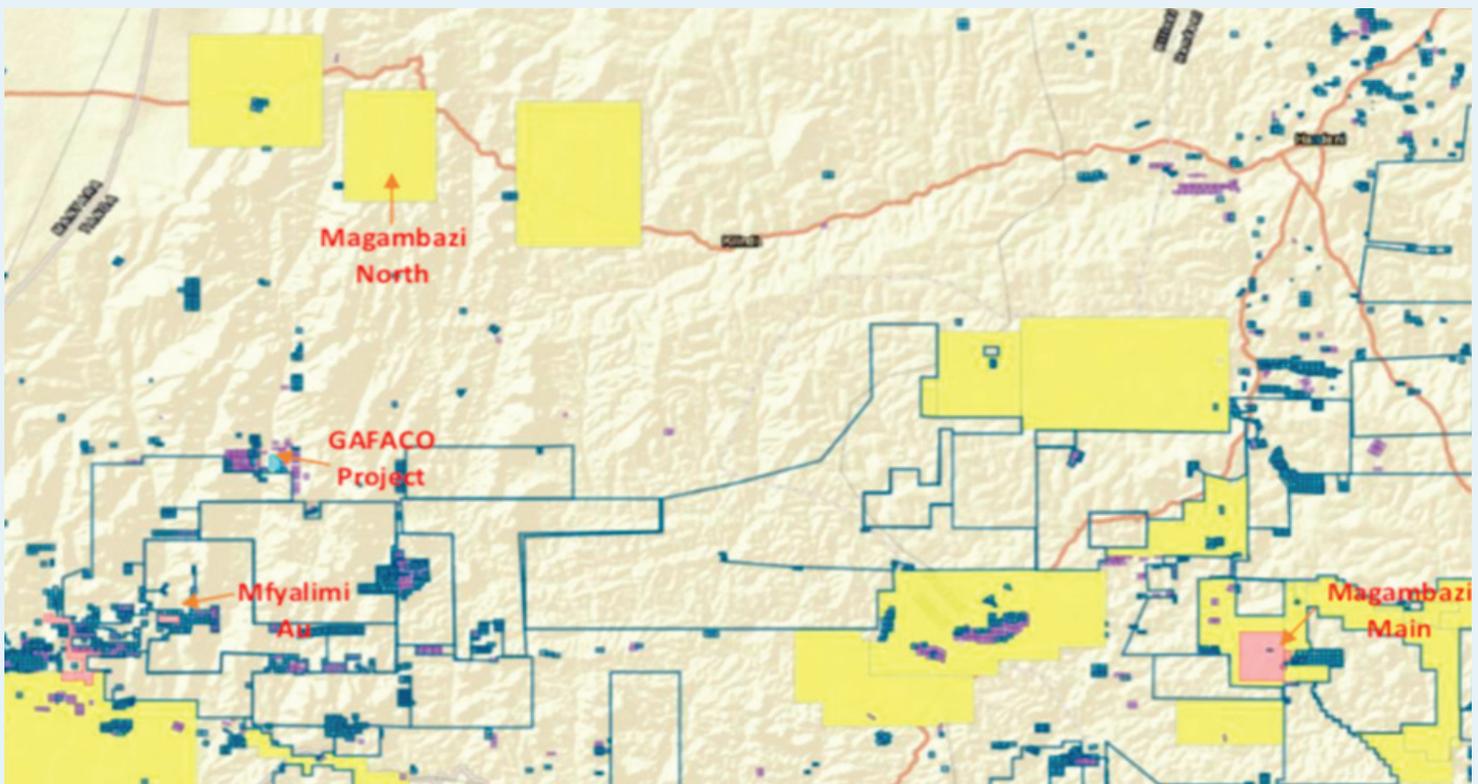

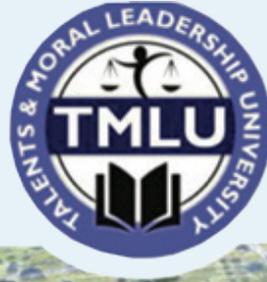

ANALYSIS OF WMI MEMBERSHIP BRANCHES NETWORK AND ONE BILLION GLOBAL MISSION 2030 STRATEGY

Multisite Network Development

WMI aims to establish a multisite network based from their studios at WAPOMEDIA Mbezi Beach Dar Es Salaam, which will serve as a central hub for content creation, member engagement activities, and training programs aimed at enhancing digital literacy among new members.

Beyond Tanzania, WMI has established a presence in a diverse set of countries across multiple continents. These include Kenya, the United States, the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), the United Kingdom (UK), Zambia, South Africa, Malawi, Burundi, Senegal (specifically Dakar), Canada, Brazil, Australia, Pakistan, Nepal, Myanmar, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Cambodia, India, Bangladesh, the Philippines, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE). This geographical spread indicates a foundation for broader international engagement.

Within these countries, certain major cities serve as significant hubs for WMI activity and membership. In Tanzania, leading cities with substantial member populations include Dar Es Salaam, Mwanza, Dodoma, Iringa, Mbeya, Musoma, Arusha, Kilimanjaro, Tanga, and Zanzibar. Nairobi is noted as a key city in Kenya. These urban centers represent critical nodes for organizing activities and engaging with members.

Building upon this existing structure, WMI has articulated a comprehensive strategic plan known as the ONE BILLION GLOBAL MISSION 2030. The overarching goal of this mission is to achieve one billion registered members and followers globally by the year 2030. This represents a massive expansion from the current base and necessitates a fundamental shift in operational scale and methodology.

The technical backbone for delivering these widespread classes will utilize multisite studio equipment provided by WAPOMEDIA. This equipment is intended to enable simultaneous broadcasting and interactive sessions across multiple locations, allowing WMI-HQ in Dar Es Salaam to effectively reach members and potential members in diverse geographical areas, overcoming physical distance limitations.

A core component of the ONE BILLION GLOBAL MISSION 2030 strategy involves the establishment and delivery of membership classes on a global scale. To facilitate this, WMI plans to leverage advanced technological infrastructure. The coordination of these global classes will be centralized from WMI-HQ located in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania, capitalizing on its position as the organization's primary hub.

A critical enabler for reaching the one billion target is the planned launch of a 1B Social Media network in November 2025. This dedicated platform is envisioned as the primary tool for mass registration and engagement, aiming to onboard the targeted one billion individuals by the 2030 deadline. The social media network will likely serve as the initial point of contact and a channel for promoting and accessing the membership classes.

To manage the vast geographical scope of the ONE BILLION GLOBAL MISSION 2030, the strategy outlines a structural division of global operations into four main divisions, distributed across all continents where WMI aims to operate. For example, within a hypothetical Africa division, regions might include East Africa (with cities like Nairobi and potentially expanding the existing Tanzanian city network), Southern Africa (including cities in South Africa, Zambia, and Malawi), Central Africa (including cities in DRC and Burundi), and West Africa (including Dakar, Senegal). Similar regional breakdowns and strategic city selections would be applied across the Americas, Asia-Pacific, and Europe/Middle East divisions, incorporating the listed countries like the United States, Canada, Brazil, Australia, Pakistan, India, Indonesia, the Philippines, the UK, and the UAE, among others, to build the infrastructure necessary for the ambitious 2030 target.

Challenges Ahead

Despite these ambitious goals, WMI faces challenges including competition from established social media platforms, ensuring user safety and privacy on their new platform, and effectively engaging diverse populations across different cultures.
